Example1

This bar graph shows the number of students in Saga University who studied abroad from 2013 to 2020. The overall number of the students studying abroad was the highest in 2015. From 2013 through 2019, although there were some differences in number, the overall number remained quite stable through the years with more than 200 students going abroad each year. In contrast, there were none in 2020. (67 words)

Example2

The number of Saga University students who studied abroad on the short program remained almost the same from 2013 to 2019. The number of the students who studied abroad for 6 months or 1 year increased from 2013 to 2015, but decreased gradually from 2016 to 2019.
